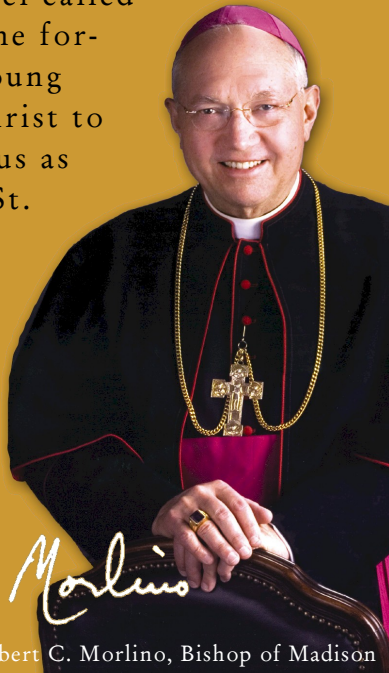


A Note from the Bishop

Catholic Education Inspired by the Gospel

Students in grades 6-12 benefit from a small class size at St. Ambrose Academy, which is located in the education wing of St. Thomas Aquinas Roman Catholic Parish on Madison's west side. Students participate in afternoon prayer and have the opportunity to attend Mass three times a week and to receive weekly confession and spiritual direction.

St. Ambrose Academy has sent faithful Catholic alumni to the seminary for the Diocese of Madison, to Princeton, UW, Boston College, University of Dallas, Franciscan University, Belmont Abbey College, Seton Hall, Edgewood College, and MATC.

Tuition is significantly lower than the national average for Catholic high schools. Need-based scholarships are provided to a third of our students.

A wide variety of extra-curricular activities includes basketball, cross-country, track and field, soccer, forensics, band, choir, yearbook, theatre, Student Council, and more.
