



Admissions

St. Ambrose Academy, Inc. is a non-profit, private Catholic school administered and staffed by Catholic laity incorporated under the laws of the State of Wisconsin.

Admissions Policy

St. Ambrose Academy admits students of any race, color, national and ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national and ethnic origin in administration of its educational policies, admissions policies, scholarship and loan programs, and athletic and other school-administered programs.

Statement of Policy and Agreement

The bishop of our diocese, Most Reverend Robert Morlino, has granted permission for St. Ambrose Academy to be called a Catholic School. St. Ambrose Academy is a lay-run organization, fully supported by Bishop Morlino.

The Board of Directors submits itself in obedience to the doctrines and beliefs of the Catholic Church. The program as instituted by the Board of Directors has as its purpose the formal Catholic education of its students in an environment respecting their moral, emotional, social, and physical well-being. The end objective is to train those entrusted to our charge to be Catholic and to express their Catholic Faith constantly and consistently in thought, word, and deed.

The Board of Directors has further resolved that this school shall be open to children from families which are prepared to impart to their children the necessary love, stimulation, motivation, and home care which comes from a well-ordered family environment. Parents agree to the following terms and conditions for participation:

1. That they will cooperate fully in fulfilling the Catholic mission of St. Ambrose Academy.
2. That they will take responsibility for being informed, supportive, and active participants in their children's education.
3. That they will maintain communication between home and school.
4. That they will meet their financial obligations to the school.
5. That they will give 75 hours of volunteer work to the school (per family, not per student). Hours not completed are subject to a ten dollar fee per hour.
6. That they will read and be bound by the *Family Handbook* and will read all emails coming through the community website, for which they must sign up online once their application is accepted.

All students are initially on probation. Probation is maintained until it is observed that the student is able to function in the program, and that the home gives the student direction and support in the area of homework and requires from the student obedience to school rules and policy.

I understand that St. Ambrose Academy's documents (such as for marketing, fundraising, etc.) may include photos of St. Ambrose students engaging in school activities. I give the school permission to include my children in these photos.

Application Format

1. Preliminary interview with student and parent(s)
2. Submission of registration forms and payment of registration fee, including signature of agreement with the policies of St. Ambrose Academy
3. Completion of student evaluation procedure
4. Written notice of acceptance decision by the Academy
5. Completion of student registration forms and payment of tuition and fees
